Dormer make excellent equipment. Their sand augers work very well in other than sandy soils, but less well in very gravelly soils. Their Jarrett-type auger heads, in my experience do not cut as well as they could because they do not have outward bent teeth and cutting edges. Price lists are available by email, and catalogues by normal postage.

Dormer stems are light weight metal, an alloy of aluminium, which is very useful if you have to carry equipment long distances.

Duff's Engineering make the best Jarrett auger heads in Australia in my opinion, with the cutting edges bent out so the auger reams out a hole slightly larger than the head, and its teeth provide a good "bite". The cutting parts can be case-hardened if requested. Auger heads can be fitted with a variety of threaded fittings so they can be used with Dormer stems.

Enviroequip is the distributor of the so-called Edelman augers made by Eijkelkamp Agrisearch Equipment, in The Netherlands. The auger heads can be very quickly and easily changed, requiring just the one stem and T-handle or lengthened by adding extensions by means of a sleeve coupling. There are a variety of heads for different types of soils. The stems are also made from light weight steel.
